- Convened over 3,000 delegates from the Australian international development sector over eight conferences, including over 600 DFAT staff and DFAT-sponsored international scholars
- Featured leading development experts and thinkers from around the world as guest speakers, including Helen Clark (former New Zealand Prime Minister & Administrator of UNDP), Martin Ravallion (former Director of Research at World Bank), Uma Kothari (former Director of the Global Development Institute, at the University of Manchester, UK) and Robert Chambers (Institute of Development Studies, UK)
- Produced several volumes of the Australian National University's <u>Development Bulletin</u>, a highly reputed publication in the field of sustainable development.

For the first time, in 2025 the conference will be held in hybrid format, enabling physical and virtual connection opportunities and expanding accessibility and inclusion for participants and presenters across Australia and overseas. As a result of this, we are expecting to attract a diverse range of speakers and over 500 participants from various countries at the 2025 conference.
